



Burman's world of visuals is fantastical, and her works have multiple meanings. The sitting Buddha, with his half-closed eyes, while also holding a lotus tree, represents meditation and introspection. The lotus is the symbol of purity of the body, speech, and mind. This composition has a dominance of the colour blue and exudes the state of tarnquility while introducing greens and vermilions through various forms that show the artist's conscious choice of making the composition dynamic and lively.





Nandan Purkayastha's works are highly intricate; they are rooted in Indian mythology, but at the same time, he also takes inspiration from old Western cowboy comics. The works use a myriad of vibrant colours, while the use of black pen and ink balances the vibrancy. His works are carnivalesque and exude a feeling of joy and celebration. Durga puja emerges as a recurring theme in his works, while idols of Durga, Kathakali dancers, and other popular figures also take center stage in his compositions.
