


this captivating artwork, Dipak Banerjee delves into the rich tapestry of Indian mythology, particularly centered around the Hindu goddess Kali. The piece pays homage to the Kalighat style of painting, originating in Kolkata during the 19th century, and showcases a diverse palette and vibrant colors indicative of the artists' unique expressions. Banerjee masterfully intertwines folk art traditions with the profound philosophy of Tantra, providing a fresh perspective that breathes life into the mythological narrative, capturing the essence of the omniscient.

In this portrayal, a youthful couple takes center stage, distinguished by the distinctive attire of the maiden—a departure from Laxma Goud's typical compositions. The artist captures the erotic rendezvous of rural inhabitants amidst the lush abundance of nature. The symbolic language of the trees resonates with the geographical identity of rural Telangana. The recurring motif of the goat, silently observing, serves as a poignant reminder of the artist's deep connection to his tribal roots.

Nandan Purkayastha's astounding painting illustrates an abstract and composite form that shines out against a vibrant crimson background. The detailed black-and-white linework combines to create a dramatic, almost sculptural presence, transporting spectators into a world of contemplation, traditional lore, social concerns and mystery. Purkayastha's rigorous effort and devotion are evident in this artwork, which embraces human and ecological colours with burlesque grandeur.

This work reflects his belief that colour is a form of energy that can stimulate our senses and bring out a range of emotions. He stretches a myriad of colours over scattered geometries of gem-like hues to create refracted compositions. Painted with the Moon-dot (chandra bindu) in the center, this painting suggests the dazzling spectrum of possibility enfolded in our everyday surroundings, reminding us of the magic in the mundane.

Each panel depicts the lotus at various phases of bloom, retelling a story of transformation and capturing a poetic grace. The calm pink blossoms emerging from the verdant foliage envision purity with diluted backdrops. The golden background alludes to a world beyond the material, to an ultimate peaceful and serene place within. Reflection is encouraged by Gupta's artwork, which whispers wisdom of the oneness and contented joy that comes from existence.

Thota Vaikuntam's artistic exploration leads him back to his cultural roots, where he discovers the compelling subjects for his paintings. The figures depicted showcase distinct features, including large red bindis adorning turmeric-sandalwood-smeared foreheads, boldly adorned colorful saris contrasting against dark skin, and ornate nose pins. These elements encapsulate the essence of Thota Vaikuntam's oeuvre. The fluidity of unbroken lines within his compositions emerges as a defining and captivating characteristic.


