By portraying the spirit of peasant life and the simplicity and beauty it embodies, Dutta's meticulous tempera technique creates a colourful tapestry that celebrates the eternal links of family and nature's persistence amid social turbulence.

"Untitled-I" from the Sepia Series by Nandan Purkayastha is an engrossing investigation of human forms, stylised contours and a satirical remark on everyday expressions. Rendered in bold Picasso-inspired forms against a textured background, the composition intertwines faces and figures in a dynamic, and surreal dance, rendering women in an essential style as well as enhancing and deepening the curvy and spiral turns and twists.




P. Gopinath's artwork combines a number of elements from Indian tradition, but one of the most important things he explored was creating his own unique pictorial language based on the concepts of architectural versus pictorial space. He was heavily influenced by Madhubani paintings and Pahadi miniatures in this endeavour. His work is multi-layered, and one can spot aspects of Indian calligraphy, hybridised birds and animals, and even indications of more complex design components.

Satish Gujral's astute observation of the profound changes in the subcontinent is encapsulated in this compelling painting. In a nation that once thrived on agrarian roots and fought for independence, the current struggle with modernity unfolds. Gujral masterfully conceals the dichotomy of man versus machine within the motif of a figure taming an ox. The twisting of leather, the wringing, and the pent-up power symbolize both tension and energy. The vivid contrast of yellows against a violet background visually accentuates this dynamic interplay.


