Known for his powerful head studies, Souza's portraits are skilfully distorted, perhaps mirroring the inner-self of his subjects, through the artist's gaze. Executed with the unassuming tools of sketch-pens and inks, Souza's fascination with Fauvist techniques gave birth to portraits that are not only emotive but also surreal, carrying an undercurrent of disconcerting qualitiesSouza skillfully portrays the subject's skin using jagged red lines, creating a striking contrast with the blue tones of the suit. This portrait transcends mere representation; it serves as a profound psychological exploration of a complex individual.





The green expanse on the left echoes the fertile lands of Barisal, Bangladesh once Ganesh Haloi's home, now a distant memory. The black organic shapes resemble drifting seeds, symbolizing his sense of uprootedness and displacement. The blue on the right evokes flowing water, reflecting time, transition, and the eternal rhythm of the Brahmaputra River. Yellow corners suggest light as fragments of hope piercing through loss. Floating triangles, circles, and wavy strokes emerge as fragments of thought — silent scripts of remembrance. In this distilled geometry lies his deeply personal language of belonging.



Layered textures mirror vegetation and silt, while faint white marks ripple like currents. Through this dreamlike realm, Haloi celebrates rivers' life-giving spirit that nourishes land and soul.

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



Manoj Dutta's domestic tableau reflects the introspection of rural womanhood through symbolic details. A mirror reveals layered identity, while lamp and window evoke modest interiors. A red plant suggests growth, scattered objects trace rituals, and intricate details—blouse, border, green wall—lovingly preserve everyday life. Dutta transforms these elements into a contemplative, symbolic space with tender visual language.

Shanti Dave's works were based on modernism, which can be seen through his formal abstraction technique. The colours are vibrant and subtle, evoking a sense of mystery, and the calligraphy, arranged in an obscure way, became central to the composition of the muralist Shanti Dave, who combined western expressionism with Indian metaphysics. This work also carries impressions from the early years, as the artist worked as a commercial artist doing banners and sign boards at the start of his career.




Shanti Dave uses layers of oil and encaustic paint that are sensitively textured to combine calligraphy with expressionist fervour in his artwork. Influenced by Devanagari and Nepalese scripts, his unique calligraphic strokes give the piece an aura of old mystery. Dave's distinctive fusion of visual art and the spirit of the written word is evident in the rich narrative tapestry that he creates in the painting using bold and expressive lines.

The composition has subliminal meanings as Gujral frequently uses tools, animals, and people in his artwork as he seeks to strike a balance between nostalgia for the past and the prospect of the future. Here, the human figure has a hold of the horse strap, perhaps trying to ride it as well as control it. Gujral uses leather, a symbol of the modern world, to create the idiom of energy. These elements, according to him, are the markers of interdependence and interrelationship between man and machine in the modern world.


